



Key Vocabulary	
Aerial map	existing, happening, or operating in the air. A photograph taken from the air.
Comic strip	a sequence of drawings in boxes that tell a story, typically printed in a newspaper or magazine.
Echo	a sound or sounds caused by the reflection of sound waves from a surface back to the listener
Evil	profound immorality and wickedness, especially when regarded as a supernatural force.
Good	that which is morally right; righteousness. Someone who chooses the right action.
Location	a particular place or position
Nocturnal	done, occurring, or active at night.
Powers	the ability or capacity to do something or act in a particular way.
Storyline	the plot of a novel, play, film, or other narrative form.
Venn diagram	A Venn diagram is an illustration of the relationships between and among sets, groups of objects that share something in common.
