









Polar Bear's Homework Autumn Term 2022

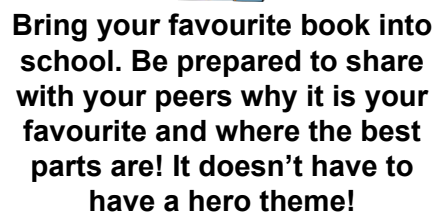
'Do all heroes wear a mask?'

Children are expected to **read** three times a week and regularly practice 'tricky words' that will come home in the form of a bookmark. Please bring book bags with reading records and reading books inside **every day**. This helps with continuity of current books and opportunities for reading throughout the week. The '**Phonics bug**' website will be updated weekly with games to enhance the children's learning from that week or unit. Login details are in your child's reading diary. You will also find login details for **Mathletics**. Activities will be allocated as we cover the new units over the year. These are optional but a really fun way to revise the learning that the children are doing in school.

For your child's homework project, they can choose four (or more) options from any of the activities below. Please include any photos, drawings or written work within this book. Please ensure your child's book is returned to school on **Friday 4th November**.

We love parents and siblings to get involved with the homework projects, however the work completed should be mainly done by the children themselves, with adult support where required. This book is still a school book so the letter formation, neatness and cleanliness expected in the classroom is also expected in this book. Please can all work be **dated and underlined**. 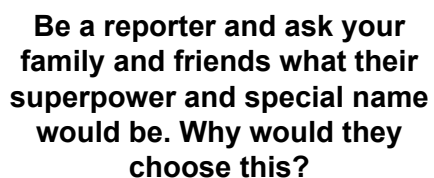

You will need to explain the rules of the game and model playing it to your friends.</p>

Take photos of your everyday “heroing”. What do you do that helps your family or friends? How do you help? How do you make life easier for the people around you?

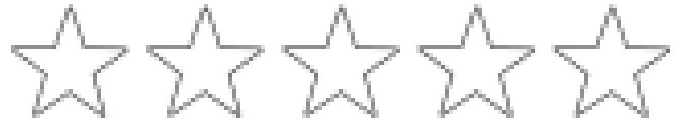
