Class Learning

Polar Bears have been working on using stop motion to bring their comic strips to life. It has been a lengthy process as the children have had to create a plot, character, props and a set as well as voicing over and filming them.

Leopards have evaluated existing chocolate wrappers and spent time deciding how fit for purpose they were for members of the public. The children then designed their own chocolate wrappers.

White Tigers have spent the week writing kennings. They focused on Remembrance Day and created powerful imagery for the reader by using two strong words between a hyphen.

Pandas have written their own descriptions based on a poppy field. They were tasked to include lots of SPaG elements that we have looked at so far; relative clauses, expanded



noun phrases, time adverbials and commas.
