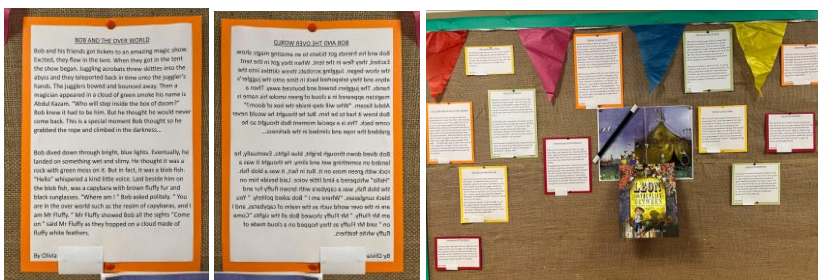
Harvest Celebration

They used glockenspiels to recreate this; initially by listening to only the first two notes and playing these confidently individually and then as a class. Next week the Pandas are looking at selecting a section of the tune and performing this as a loop.



Polar Bear&Leopards Class: Computing and Reading

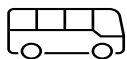

Leopard Class: Role playing Bus Journeys and Discussions – How to be courteous and well-mannered while travelling on a bus.
