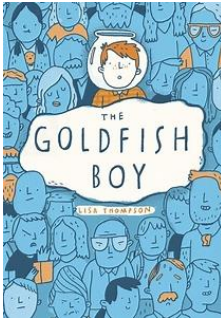
To celebrate World Book Day on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March, we have teamed up with **Scholastic Book Club**.
