The results of the tests will be sent out to parents once they arrive in school in July and on to secondary schools. Mrs Botham still has to complete the Teacher Assessments which also form part of the information sent to new schools including an assessment of writing. The writing assessment takes place as part of normal school work and a sample of schools are moderated each year to ensure results are consistent and fair. Mrs Botham is a qualified writing moderator so will be helping other schools to do this during the summer term.
