Class Learning

Polar Bears have looked at RNLI and how we can stay safe by the water. The children now know to 'Run, Yell and tell' if they see something not right or someone/thing in danger by the water.



The Leopards have looked at the stages of human life in Science. The children really enjoyed seeing the evolution of a baby to a grown human, they had some great discussions about what could be done and achieved at each stage.

White Tigers have started looking at persuasive letters; keen to share with others how we can look after our world. They have looked at three key impacts: environment, humans and wildlife and are now planning a clear argument for each with facts and evidence to support each point.

In Pandas, the children completed a Science experiment involving their shoes. They predicted and then tested the friction of the soles of their shoes with Newton metres on three different surfaces. The children were surprised that different shoes worked either better or worse on each of the surfaces rather than all performing the same.
